Mission Statement:

The agreed Mission Statement of UCD RFC is to *“create a rugby-playing environment that caters for the needs of student players, from the elite to the recreational level, but which concentrates, to a greater extent, on enabling the elite players to achieve rugby excellence and academic success.”*

Club Tradition:

Since its affiliation to the Leinster Branch of the IRFU in January, 1910, UCD RFC has enjoyed a favourable reputation in Irish rugby. UCD RFCs tradition is to play an attractive and skillful brand of rugby with full commitment and total integrity. To maintain this tradition, UCD RFC members and supporters will:

- Expect the rugby game to be played in a sporting and entertaining manner,
- Respect the President, Captain, Officers and all other Members of this Club,
- Respect the Referee and match-day Officials,
- Behave in a manner, both on and off the field of play, which will enhance the sporting reputation and tradition of UCD RFC.

Player selection:

Player selections are generally confirmed on Thursday evenings during the season. Playing members are automatically assumed to be available for selection unless they, otherwise, inform and in good time, the relevant captain, coach or manager. This procedure is intended to prevent disruption to UCD RFC teams. Selected players and named substitutes for home games should report to the dressing rooms 90 minutes before the stated kick-off time. Travel arrangements for away matches will be agreed no later than Thursday evenings.

Player subscriptions:

Players' annual subscriptions are to be paid before 31st October, 2021 to the Junior Club Treasurer. This membership subscription automatically includes personal insurance cover. However, this insurance should be reviewed and additional insurance cover should be arranged, personally, if deemed appropriate.

Tickets, for Ireland’s international matches, are allocated to active and fully paid-up Club members, in as fair a manner as possible. All members will receive an application form which should be returned, with full payment, to Terry Buckley.

Pitches and changing rooms:

UCD RFC teams play their home matches and train at the UCD Bowl and other adjacent rugby pitches at Thornfield. Changing rooms are located at the UCD Bowl and also the UCD Sport Centre. Evening training is conducted under floodlights at times to be posted for specific team squads.

Car parking and car parking restrictions:

Failure to comply with UCD parking regulations will result in “clamping” and a payment of a release fee. (UCD RFC is not responsible for administering such parking arrangements). Vehicles should be parked in three ways in UCD:

- * Buy a “Permit” as Staff/student member of UCD, which costs €50 per annum, and which allows the permit holder to park in “Permit” designated car parks at any time.**
- * During UCD terms and normal working hours, those without parking permits must only use the “Pay and Display” car parks, which require an immediate cash payment for a parking ticket, which should be prominently displayed.**
- * On Saturday and Sunday, ALL parking areas are free with the exception of Premium parking spaces at the UCD Sport and Fitness Centre Car Park.**

The Conroy Cup was presented by UCD RFC to the Irish Universities Rugby Union in honour of the late Judge Conroy and his late son, Paddy, both of whom made significant contributions to UCD, Leinster and Irish rugby. Judge Conroy was President of UCD RFC in 1953/54, having won a Metropolitan Cup medal with UCD in 1924/25. He also acted as Honorary Secretary of the Leinster Branch from 1961 to 1972 and was instrumental in introducing the Under 19 age grade into Leinster rugby - now replaced by the Under 20 age grade. He was elected President of the IRFU in 1972/73. His son, Paddy Conroy, was Honorary Secretary of UCD RFC for many years and subsequently became Honorary Secretary of the Leinster Branch from 1978 to 1985. Paddy Conroy was also elected President of UCD RFC, but died suddenly in his year of office (1987/88). *RIP*

UCD RFC – DOWN THROUGH THE YEARS

- 1910** UCD RFC is affiliated to the Leinster Branch, IRFU as a Junior club (10th January 1910), on the proposal of Bective Rangers, which was seconded by Monkstown. (Previously, a “National University XV” existed in the 1880s but without success or continuity). UCD becomes the youngest of the five Irish University rugby clubs and play occasional matches at Jones’ Road which is now part of the Croke Park complex.
- 1914** UCD win their first Rugby trophy, the (then) Junior Cup – for clubs below senior level - beating Merrion 24-0 in the final. This win makes UCD eligible to apply for senior status but this was delayed due to WW1.
- 1917/18** In the continued absence of competitive rugby, UCD play a small number of friendly fixtures, one of which was an inaugural friendly against UCC, which was drawn (3 – 3) in March, 1918.
- 1919/20** Senior status was formally granted on 21st May, 2019. UCD play their first official senior fixture as a Senior Club, but are defeated by TCD, (14 – 11) at the new Terenure grounds (18th October 1919). On being admitted to the Dudley Cup for the first time, UCD won the trophy, beating Queen’s (3 – 0) in the final. Andy Courtney and P. J. Stokes are the first UCD players to be capped by Leinster. Andy Courtney (a prop forward) becomes the first UCD player to be capped for Ireland (away, v. Scotland and won by Scotland, 19 – 0).
- 1920/21** UCD reach the Leinster Senior Cup final for first time but are beaten by TCD (0 – 5).
- 1921/22** UCD win the inaugural Metropolitan Cup (J1), beating Blackrock 11-3 in the final.
- 1924** UCD win the Leinster Senior Cup for the first time, beating Monkstown 12-3 in the final (Captain: Alex Spain).
- 1925/26** UCD reach Leinster Senior Cup for fifth time in six years, but lose to TCD (3-11).
- 1927/28** UCD RFC fields 3 teams regularly each week-end and supplies 14 players to St. Vincent’s in winning the Hospitals’ cup, including Irish Olympian, Sean Lavan (440 yards in 1924 and 1928) who scored 4 tries for the winners.
- 1929** UCD, with other clubs, ask the IRFU to approve that matches be played on Sundays. However, the IRFU declines this suggestion!
- 1930/31** UCD play their first Colours match - against Queen’s University. The Colours match rotates against Queen’s and UCC in alternative years.
- 1931/32** UCD are influential, with a few other Clubs, in persuading the IRFU to fly the Irish flag at international matches at Lansdowne Road.
- 1934/35** UCD teenage centre, Aidan Bailey, who had been capped as a schoolboy while at Presentation College, Bray (playing for Lansdowne), plays in all three international matches as Ireland win their first Championship since 1899.
- 1936** New pitches at Belfield, near the Stillorgan Road entrance, are officially opened with UCD beating Monkstown. The playing pitches are described as “being far from the city centre and being badly served by buses”.

UCD RFC – Down through the years (continued)

- 1937/38** UCD win Leinster Senior Cup for second time. A week later UCD become All Ireland champions by winning the Bateman Cup, beating Young Munster in the final (16 – 6), having beaten Instonians in the semi-final the previous day (Captain: Tim Boland).
- 1939** UCD prop forwards, Tom Headon and Jim Ryan play for Ireland against both Scotland and Wales.
- 1941/42** The Second (J1) XV, under the captaincy of Reggie Spellman, win both the Junior League and Metropolitan Cup.
- 1943** UCD win Minor (J2) league for third successive season.
- 1947/48** Having been beaten in three Senior Cup finals in the previous five years, UCD beat TCD (4 – 0) in the Leinster Senior Cup final, with a drop-goal by outhalf, JD Hackett, which was then worth 4 points). This is UCD's third win in this competition (Captain: Gerry O'Reilly).
- 1951/52** For the last International match of season against England (Away), Ireland award new caps to three UCD players – Mick Hillary, "Boldie" O'Neill and Paddy Kavanagh.
- 1952** The inaugural Colours match against TCD is played at "the international rugby ground at Lansdowne Road" and won by UCD 13-6 (Saturday, 13th December).
- 1954** The Irish Universities play their first Universities' rugby international (v. Scotland) with three UCD players: Harry Crowe, Alan McGonagle and PJ O'Grady.
- 1954** UCD win CYM/Keating Cup (Leinster Junior 7s) for fourth year in succession.
- 1956/57** A "fiery and talented" UCD J1 team win the Junior League (J1) Metropolitan Cup (J1), the CYM sevens and North Kildare sevens
- 1959** Niall Brophy and Bill Mulcahy become first UCD players to be selected for the Lions, and toured Australia and New Zealand.
- 1960/61** UCD celebrate Golden Jubilee with Sarsfield Hogan as Club President and Henry Wall as Club Captain. The Freshmen XY won the O'Connell cup and that team features three future Presidents of UCD RFC: Adrian Burke, Malachy Coughlan and Brian Keogh.
- 1962** In February, UCD prop forward Ray McLoughlin, who helped to modernise Irish international rugby, wins his first of forty caps, when playing against England at Twickenham. His last cap was awarded 13 years later in March, 1975.
- 1962/63** UCD become the first Leinster club to win the Senior, Metropolitan (J1) and O'Connell (J2) cups in the same season. The 1st XV cup side – captained by Jimmy Kelly - contained five internationals: Frank Byrne, Pat Casey, John Murray, Jimmy Kelly and PJ Dwyer.
- 1963/64** Jimmy Kelly becomes the first UCD player to captain Ireland, (v. New Zealand, 7th December). For 1963/64 UCD supply six players (or former players) to the international team: Jimmy Kelly, Pat Casey, PJ Dwyer, Al Moroney, Ray McLoughlin and Bill Mulcahy. UCD retain the Leinster Senior Cup and 2nd XV retain the Metropolitan Cup. The UCD club was captained by Mick Doyle.

UCD RFC – Down through the years (continued)

- 1964/65** Irish Universities (past & present) become the first Irish side to beat a South Africa team with six UCD affiliated players (Mick Carey, Billy Glynn, Tony Hickie, Al Moroney, John Murray and Henry Wall).
- 1968** UCD's Barry Bresnihan, on his second Lions tour, becomes the first official international replacement in rugby history in a match against Western Transvaal. (The International Rugby Board had sanctioned official replacements for injured players two months earlier).
- 1969** Leinster U.19 play their first match with six UCD players (Peter Boylan, Tony Ensor, Leo Galvin, Kevin Mays, Liam Naughton, and Henry Stewart).
- 1969/70** Under the captaincy of Derek Scally and coached by Jimmy Kelly, UCD win the Leinster Senior Cup for the sixth time, beating Terenure (14 – 3) in the final. Six of this team would play for Ireland (Shay Deering, Fergus Slattery, Tom Grace, Kevin Mays and Con Feighery and Tom Feighery). Also, Frank O'Driscoll and Henry Murphy played on Ireland's tour of Argentina, but no (official) international caps were awarded.
- 1974/75** The Combined Irish Universities play New Zealand with 7 UCD players (John Cantrell, James Crowe, Ray Finn, Paddy Gahan, Kevin Mays, Declan Molloy and Conor Sparks).
- 1976** UCD win McCorry cup (U.19) for the fourth successive season.
- 1977** UCD win the Leinster Senior Cup for the seventh time, beating Terenure 9-6 in the final (Captain: Dave Ramsey and Coach: Al Moroney).
- 1978** Irish Universities, with nine UCD players, tour New Zealand.
- 1984** UCD, under captain Willie Burns and coached by Ed Thornton, reach the Leinster Senior Cup final but were beaten by Wanderers. The match was played a few days after UCD had beaten St. Mary's in the replayed semi-final. UCD would not appear again in this cup final until their 2010/11 centenary season.
- 1984** UCD become the first Leinster Rugby club to tour Australia.
- 1984/85** Former UCD Captain and International, Mick Doyle, coaches Ireland to Triple Crown and International Championship success.
- 1986/87** UCD Freshmen win Minor Cup and League (Captain: Paddy Barr) and 3rd A (J3) team win Moran Cup (Captain: Joe Barrett).
- 1993** In the annual Old Belvedere sevens, UCD beat a much fancied London Irish side in the first round. (UCD then lost their second round tie against Bective Rangers!)
- 1993/94** UCD enter the AIL and become Division 3 Champions, conceding only 4 tries in their eleven matches (Captain: Andy Donovan and Coach Bobby Byrne). The Irish Universities tour South Africa with 8 UCD players: Paddy Barr, Killian Keane, Hubie Kos, Kerry-Mark McCarthy, Greg McConkey, Darragh O'Mahony, Kevin Spicer and Paddy Walsh.

UCD RFC – Down through the years

- 1994/95** After an unlucky campaign, UCD are relegated from Division 2 of the AIL. UCD winger, Darragh O'Mahony, becomes the first UCD player to play in the Rugby World Cup. The Winters Cup, presented to the Leinster Branch by UCD in honour of former president Colonel 'Nicky' Winters in 1962/63, is finally won by UCD (v. DLSP). This was the only official Leinster Branch trophy which UCD had not won to date.
- 1995/96** Another disappointing season in which the First XV finish second from bottom in Division 3 of the AIL. However, there is no relegation due to reorganisation of the AIL structure.
- 1996/97** Having lost 16 players from last year's senior squad, the First XV, under coaches Lee Smith and Paul Barr, won both the Colours match and the Dudley Cup.
- 1997/98** The UCD Rugby Academy is established. UCD finish 3rd in the AIL (Division 3) but miss out on promotion due to "points" differential to Ballynahinch. UCD supply five players to Ireland's (U. 20s) Rugby World Cup win in France in April, 1998 - Damian Broughall, Neil Coughlan, Shane Moore, Andy O'Brien and Brian O'Driscoll.
- 1998/99** UCD become Division 3 champions of AIL (Captain: Gordon Cantwell; Coaches: Lee Smith and Dara Rowley). Ciaran Scally gets capped in the Six Nations, and Brian O'Driscoll wins the first of his 133 Irish caps (v. Australia, in June 1999)
- 1999/00** A dramatic end to the season saw UCD and Clontarf draw (40 – 40) in the UCD Bowl in the first leg Division One/Two playoff with Clontarf winning the second leg (16 – 21) to retain their Division 1 status and UCD remain in Division 2.
- 2000/01** UCD now win Division 2 of the AIL and become the first Irish University Division 1 club. The first XV has an overall win record of 79%, which is the best in Leinster. The McCorry cup was regained after a gap of seven years.
- 2001/02** Former UCD prop, Dave Hewett, is capped for New Zealand and scores a try against Ireland on his debut at Lansdowne Road. UCD finish a comfortable 6th place in their first season in AIL Division 1.
- 2002/03** UCD guarantee their Division 1 status with a final-day victory (away) to Terenure. UCD complete a clean sweep of Irish University competitions, including the Colours match. The Fanagan League (U. 20) is won for the first time.
- 2003/04** UCD finish in 10th position in AIL Division 1. The annual colours match is won for the eight successive season. In addition, the Dudley and Conroy cups are retained, as is the Fanagan (U. 20) league.
- 2004/05** UCD finish in 6th place in AIL Division 1, having been top of the table at Christmas. The Colours match is drawn (20 – 20). The Fanagan League (U.20) is won for the third successive season and the McCorry (U.20) is also won. Due to fixture congestion and other reasons, the Dudley Cup competition was, regrettably, not completed.

UCD RFC – Down through the years

- 2005/06** UCD finish 9th in the AIL Division 1, which included a victory in the Colours match (25 – 13). The Fanagan league (U 20) is retained for the fourth successive season and the U 20B won the Brian Purcell Cup for the first time, beating TCD in an excellent final.
- 2006/07** A penalty kick, converted in the closing minutes of the final match of the season, keeps UCD in AIL Division 1. The Colours match was lost (13 – 16) for the first time in 11 years. UCD supply a large number of players to various representative teams including Robert Kearney who is awarded his senior cap for Ireland.
- 2007/08** The annual Colours match was won by a record margin (50 – 20). Brian O’Driscoll becomes the second UCD player to captain Ireland.
- 2008/09** In the last AIL match of the season, a last minute drop goal by Young Munster resulted in defeat and relegation for UCD, after 8 successive seasons in AIL Division 1.
- 2009/10** UCD regained the Colours (28 – 8) but finished in a misleadingly low 13th position in Division 2 of the AIL. Both the Dudley and Conroy Cups are retained, and the U. 20B won the Purcell Cup.
- 2010/11** UCD celebrate their Centenary season. The Leinster Senior Cup was won for the eight time, in dramatic fashion, with a converted try with the last play of the game (Captain Andy Cummiskey). UCD achieved promotion to Division 1B, as runners up, even though beaten in their final league/Colours match by TCD (31 -22). The U. 21 (now U. 20) A XV won the Fraser McMullen cup for the first time. The Dudley and Conroy Cups were both retained by UCD.
- 2011/12** The U. 21 squad had a season of unprecedented success, winning the Conroy cup (Irish universities), Fanagan league, McCorry cup, Frazer McMullen (All Ireland) cup, and the Maher cup (v. Trinity). The First XV won the Dudley cup (Irish universities) and the annual Colours match. The J1 XV won the Metropolitan plate and the U. 21 “B” XV won the Purcell cup. In the last match of the season, a necessary (but improbable) bonus point victory in the Bowl (v. Dungannon) ensured survival in the Division 1B for UCD.
- 2012/13** Another stunning finale to the season with the First XV defeating Shannon (away) in the promotion/relegation play-off match (42 – 0) and securing promotion to Division 1A. The U. 21 squad lost only one match in retaining the McCorry cup, the Fanagan league, Conroy and Maher trophies.
- 2013/14** The Leinster Senior Cup was won for the ninth time by beating Terenure (23 – 18, Captain: Shane Grannell) but UCD were beaten by Cork Constitution (away) in the final of the Bateman cup. The First XV finished third in Division 1A, which represents UCDs highest ever AIL finish. However, there was no “top 4” play-off for the Championship.

UCD RFC – Down through the years

- 2014/15** UCD 1st XV secured 6th position in Division 1A. However, UCD were unluckily beaten by Clontarf in the final of the Leinster Senior Cup. The Colours fixture, which was the last match of the season, returned to the UCD Bowl and in front of a large and appreciative crowd, UCD snatched a dramatic win (32 – 29) in the final minutes.
- 2015/16** Sean O’Brien becomes the third UCD player to captain Ireland (v. Scotland, 15th August, 2015). The First XV win the Leinster Senior cup for the 10th time (Captain: Stephen Murphy) by beating Old Belvedere (23 – 13) in an entertaining final. After comfortably leading the Division 1A table at Christmas, a string of losses consigned UCD to an away play-off semi-final to Clontarf. The resulting defeat (10 – 24) came after a disappointing defeat by Cork Constitution (0 – 24) in the Bateman Cup semi-final and the loss in the annual Colours match (15 – 28).
- 2016/17** In early season, UCD toured South Africa, and won all 3 matches. UCD won the McCorry Cup final (30 – 13) against Clontarf.
- 2017/18** Retained the McCorry Cup, beating Terenure (20 – 14) after being in arrears by 0 – 14 points. The UCD J4 team lost to Old Wesley in the cup final.
- 2019/20** The UCD RFC (August) tour of Canada was an outstanding success both on and off the pitch. In domestic rugby, the 1st XV beat Clontarf in the Leinster Senior Cup final at the Bowl, The J1 and J4 teams won their respective leagues. Many of UCD current and former players are awarded Representative honours.
- 2020/21** The season was heavily disrupted by the Covid-19 virus.

REVIEW OF SEASON (2020/21) & PREVIEW OF SEASON (2021/22)

The past rugby season (2020/21) will be remembered, for the most part, for COVID-19 virus which caused the cancellation of most matches, and which lead to unfinished rugby cups, leagues and other competitive matches.
